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A brief content of the course:

English language I (Headway Elementary) contains a balanced syllabus with a concentration into basic grammar of English. This level is supported by various teaching tools and work in classroom. Basic English is manifested through various thematic texts of daily English, work in pairs of students thus providing them the skills for dialogue in basic English and provides possibility for some comparative cultural analysis between Albanian language and English language. Additional value in sustainability of basic lessons is constituted by the work book which provides exercises in written for all lessons developed in the class..

Aim of the course

This course is designed for foreigners learning English at an Elementary level to acquire and develop the English language knowledge and skills. The students learn to pronounce, read and write. They acquire their knowledge of fundamental grammatical structures and functions (e.g. sentence types, tenses, voice, parts of speech, word order, expressing possibility, obligation, necessity, prohibition, criticism; expressing preferences, making assumptions; asking for/refusing/giving permission; making offers, suggestions, etc.) They acquire their fundamental vocabulary to fulfil the above mentioned functions in roles, topics and discussions.

Expected learning outcomes:

- to learn pronunciation of the English sounds, to learn to read, write, and to know the fundamentals of English grammar and vocabulary
- to develop the students' reading skills to enable them to skim an adapted text for main idea, to scan an adapted text for specific information, to interpret to an adapted text for inferences.

Teaching methodology:

Teaching English as foreign language to Year II students is developed through lectures, direct method, audio lingual means and visual aids, repeating and rephrasing, group work, use of bilingual materials, communicative language teaching.
