#### Përmbledhja e shkurtër e lëndës:

Headway Intermediate is an advanced level of English language which follows to previous levels, respectively, basic and high basic. This level enables students to develop advanced vocabulary of English language as well as independent creative work in thematic and different researches. Presupposing that students possess competencies in all grammar categories (tenses, voices, indirect clauses etc.) this level provides enough space for students to explore texts and inter-texts, compare and analyse them in detail and various viewpoints. Besides the linguistic aspect, this level provides advanced and cultural and universal knowledge.

#### Aim of the course

This course is designed for students or pupils who wants to learn English as a foreign language at the fourth or Intermediate level in order to acquire and develop knowledge and skills of English language. Students acquire their knowledge of the highest structural and grammatical functions level (ex. Types of sentences, grammar tenses, voice, parts of speech, order of words in sentence expression of possibilities, obligations, necessities, prohibitions, critics, preferences, raise of suppositions, ask or refuse a permission, submit an offer, suggestions, etc). They acquire a more advanced vocabulary into fulfilment of the function and roles in topics and discussions mentioned above.

### **Expected learning outcomes:**

By the end of this course students are expected to be able to more competently:

use / understand advanced social expressions;

use / understand specific contexts and collocations

give / understand opinions;

give / understand requests and offers;

use / understand travel related language;

use / understand articles and analysis

use / understand quantity related language.

Among the types of grammar students will be exposed to in order to help them do this are: **Grammar:** Auxiliary Verbs; Tenses; Questions and Negatives; Short Answers; the Present Simple, Continuous and Passive Present tenses; the Past Simple, Continuous and Passive tenses; Modal Verbs of Obligation and Permission; the Future forms: 'going to' and 'will'; Questions with 'like'; Verb Patterns; the Present First and Second Conditionals; Time clauses; the Present Perfect Continuous; Indirect questions; Questions tags; Reported speech: statements; questions, requests/commands

## **Teaching methodology:**

Teaching English as foreign language to Year III students is developed through lectures, direct method, audio lingual means and visual aids, repeating and rephrasing, group work, use of bi-lingual materials, communicative language teaching.
