Course Description:

The Qur'an course is one of the most important subjects at the Faculty of Islamic Studies, as the Qur'an represents the fundamental foundation of Islam. The course includes three main areas: memorization of the first Juz' of the Qur'an; correct recitation from various chapters with the Qur'an open; and the theoretical rules of proper recitation, namely Tajwid. This course is engaging, interactive, and spiritual in nature.

Course Objectives:

- To connect students with the Holy Qur'an through reading and memorization.
- To correct and improve students' Qur'anic recitation.
- To provide theoretical knowledge of the rules of Tajwid.
- To familiarize students with unfamiliar words encountered during recitation.

Expected Learning Outcomes

- Advancement in students' Qur'anic recitation skills.
- Theoretical and practical understanding of Tajwid.
- Memorization of 20 pages of the Holy Qur'an.
- Ability to explain the rules of proper Qur'anic recitation.

- Enabling students to teach others these competencies upon successful completion of all semesters.

Teaching Methodology:

Teaching will be conducted through lectures and interactive discussions. Projectors will be used for PowerPoint presentations. Seminars, essays, and evaluation tests will be organized and presented individually and in groups. Practical implementation will include students' recitation before the professor. Students may contact the professor for guidance during course preparation.

Week 5: Isti'adhah and Basmalah. Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (p. 9). Reading: *Ali Imran* (pp. 70–76).

Week 6: Makharij al-Huruf. Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (pp. 10–11). Reading: *An-Nisa* (pp. 77–81).

Week 7: Continuation of Makharij al-Huruf. Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (p. 12). Reading: *An-Nisa* (pp. 82–86).

Week 8: Sifat al-Huruf. Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (p. 13). Reading: *An-Nisa* (pp. 87–91).

Week 9: Continuation of Sifat al-Huruf. Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (pp. 14–15). Reading: *An-Nisa* (pp. 92–96).

Week 10: Midterm Exam.

Week 11: Rules of Noon Sakin and Tanwin (Idhhar & Idgham). Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (pp. 16–17). Reading: *An-Nisa* (pp. 97–101).

Week 12: Rules of Noon Sakin and Tanwin (Ikhfa & Iqlab). Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (pp. 18–19).

Week 13: Rules of Mim Sakin. Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (p. 20). Reading: *An-Nisa* (pp. 102–106).

Week 14: Memorization: *Al-Baqarah* (p. 21). Reading: *Al-An 'am* (pp. 106–111).

Week 15: Comprehensive review and conclusion.
